Summer Reflections!

Each time I lift my head from my work to take stock of my surroundings, I am amazed and grateful (and truthfully, also a little overwhelmed)! My world is so large and so spread out! Will I be able to pay attention to it all; do all that is expected of me; and yet remain present to the inspiration of God's Spirit, I wonder?

I am reminded of my mother, who I imagined lived a much simpler life. She gave up any hopes of a career to focus on the wellbeing and safety of her family, preparing them to live in an environment that was suspicious of Christians. While she held all things together gracefully, she was also planning for a better future for herself and her family. It had to be a worrisome time for her; placing her trust in God and wondering if she was doing enough. Most Christian families then, lived in communities that shared the same vision for the future. And they all made it to the Promised Land. We couldn't have made it without our communities that ensured safety: both physical and spiritual.

What was God doing in me the whole time? I realize now he had designed me to be to be aware of my surroundings. A therapist once told me that when I first came to this country I probably arrived with some degree of PTSD (Post Traumatic Stress Disorder). There was nothing 'Post' about it! There were 'new' traumatic stresses to endure. But there was purpose to these, I realize now! Many of you do understand what I'm trying to say. Life is a series of new events and journeys; not always easy or enjoyable. We do what is needed without feeling fearful or sorry for ourselves and we move forward. God's Spirit goes with us, wordlessly advising and protecting us!

I remember the churches I have belonged to because they were not just Sunday Morning affairs for me: they were life-sustaining communities I needed so I could thrive. They provided me with warmth that felt like sunshine. Our natural inclination is to seek out the Sun for warmth and our sense of wellbeing. So, we look up often!

When I lift up my head to check my surroundings, it's with hope that I search to see whether my community today is on high ground, beyond immediate danger; safe and ready to thrive in new ways, always ready to move forward. We, Christians, are a people of perpetual movement. We move over to make place for more people to join us in worship. We add place settings at the table to share meals. We look up often to see if the community is doing well.

After completing my first eight months here with you I accept you as my new community with confidence. I see a stirring of the Spirit among you that assures me that we are in good hands. It isn't just up to me I realize! The Spirit has granted me the vision to see with fresh eyes your strengths and opportunities. And believe me, you have them both in abundance. There is, of course, decay and disfunction that must be remedied. But because God's Spirit is here present with you in full force, you will be compelled to see where changes are necessary and 'go to work'.

How blessed we are that the Worship Committee has captured the vision. How hopeful we are that the Elders Committee is taking their work seriously and want to know more before they apply their ministry in fresh new ways rather than defaulting tired out traditions. How lucky we are to have the funds to refresh the exterior of our beautiful historical building. We are drinking fresh water from the streams God has supplied; we are eating fresh fruits of God's good earth; and we are singing God's praises more melodiously than ever before.

I bow my head in humility and gratitude!

Elder Note - August 2025

I like the depiction of August as "the Sunday of Summer."

Sunday is the end of the week, and August is the end of summer (almost). Sunday is a time for slowing down, for rest and recreation, for getting away, and for being with family, friends and nature. It is also a time for worship. And so is August. Merriam Webster's dictionary defines "august" as:

"inspiring reverence or admiration; of supreme dignity or grandeur."

August inspires reverence for the last precious remaining days of summer. You don't want to let these days slip by unsavored. They slip by because you are not savoring each moment. It's not time that moves too fast. It's your mind that moves too fast. Your mind jumps back into the past or forward to the future. Neither past nor future is real; only the present moment is. Revere the present moment as sacred.

Reverence for the present moment is a spiritual practice. All the world's religions teach us to make the most of every moment, for the opportunity each moment brings may not come again.

In some spiritual practices, being fully aware in the moment is known as "practicing the presence of God." See the presence of the Divine in all activity, whether it's washing dishes, being stuck in traffic or conversing with someone. God is present in every moment, in every activity and in every being. Don't let your mind take you away from that presence.

To paraphrase Simon & Garfunkel in "59th Street Bridge Song", "Slow down, your mind moves too fast. You got to make the summer last." Take a slow, deep breath. Settle inward. Find your center — your Self. Based in Self, you see more clearly. The "supreme dignity and grandeur" is revealed, inside and outside, in every moment. That's waking up. That's how you live through August with no regrets and a ton of gratitude.
