Friends,

Yesterday I received a call from a good friend who was simplychecking in but left me with much to think about. I'm going to refer to this friend as 'Jack' (alluding to 'Jack of all trades and master of none'!) I mean no disrespect to Jack. He is skilled in many ways and bears a willing heart. He is both a leader and a servant. He expects to be a master of none. Our chat was useful in expanding my outlook.

Jack and his family are faithful and passionate believers. They love their church, they tithe generously, and they keep up with study. So, you can see the problem...Jack believes he has got it right! He is fixed in his beliefs and is hard to move. He has fine-tuned his arguments, so one is forced to give in and throw up one's hands to preserve the friendship. Jack is in the process of looking for a new church. This is traumatic for him. He watches various Sunday morning services online; evaluates the quality of the sermon; the presence of little children (he has grand-children); and ministries where he can offer his many and varied gifts. What he cannot find is a church that keeps Communion at its center.

He feels free to challenge me and so he pushes me to be the Minister of 'his ideal church.' The conversation we had revolved around the subject of 1) How do we grow the church? and 2) How do we draw young people back to church to ensure longevity? He has seen his church decline in number, lose children's ministry and await its imminent death. He gives them five years. He has used his imagination, every skill and talent he has, all his spare time, and has run out of ideas.

It so happens that I have just returned from a week-long seminar on Church in the Secular World, a hot topic right now in the United States that sheds light on what Jack is wrestling with. The author, Andy Root, is passionate about this subject and has written a slew of well-received books on the future of church.

The truth is: There's no simple answer! Because the church is God's domain. No one can solve this problem (we've tried). Let's ask God! Jack would argue that we can't afford to stand around and do nothing. 'Not so!' God is waiting for us to settle down and await his guidance. When we take the initiative to put into action our own plans, we are relying on something other than God (ourselves). When we become enamored with what we're doing; we place all our hopes in ourselves...and God is forgotten!

What if we humbly admitted to God that we are lost? Even when God enlivens us, we graciously commit to following God and not pushing Him aside. God will not let us fail if we trust God! Remember Abraham and Isaac?

But Jack argues! "We just need to think in new ways: outside the box!' We need to come up with doing church in ways that are meaningful to the young. We need to stay active." To him, what I propose amounts to day-dreaming!

So, good people of Central Christian Church! What do you think?

Pray first, before forming an opinion. Of the two perspectives presented in this article, where do you find hope? Maybe at a point in between, or in a blend of both. What might that look like? Pray first; then ask for God's vision to be revealed! Are we going to approach this dilemma from the standpoint of doubt and fear? Or do we place all our trust and hope in God, who will surely point us in the right direction!

Starts All Over Again: A Fall Guide to Love, Learning, and Friendship

Life starts all over again when it gets crisp in the fall, a quote from –F. Scott Firzgerald, The Great Gatsby, and it is absolutely true.

The kids are starting back to school, commercials about the best buys for school supplies, new fall clothes shopping for some of the kids and parents alike. Football season is now underway, ads for pumpkin in almost everything. The color of the trees is starting to darken, getting ready to change and thrill us with the brilliant colors and doesn't the air smell just a bit different? For most of us our vacations are winding down and we are settling back to our lives.

Mr. Ewell said this is a time of hope, a moment of possibilities. It's a time of getting back to old friends and making new ones. We can forget summer failures, believe in fresh opportunities. We can take a chance to dream of what the day might become. In the fall he is fueled with the desire to learn, grow and pursue the visions in his head and heart for his life.

Back to school with God

This new season gives us inspiration about how to engage in our relationship with God. Enrolling in his classroom makes all other learning possible. **Proverbs 18:15 ERV** The spiritually wis are those who realize how much more they need to learn. For anyone who believes in God, this means always learning more and listening closely to his Word to better understand hao to be close to him. Revelation2 offers ultimate spiritual back-to-school assessment:

"I know your deeds, your tireless labor, and your patient endurance. I know you do not tolerate those who do evil. Furthermore, you have diligently tested those who claim to be emissaries, and you have found that they are not true witnesses. You have correctly found them to be false. I know you are patiently enduring and holding fir on behalf of My name. You have not become fain. However, I have this against you: You have abandoned your first love. Do you remember what it was like before you fell? It's time to rethink and change your ways: go back to how you first acted, if you do not return, I will come quickly and personally remove your lampstand from its place." Revelation 2:2-5 Voice

As Jesus addresses Christians in these verses, he brings forward the most important subject we can learn: loving and desiring a relationship with God. This first love is the catalyst that makes our second love possible: loving people.

Many of us know the rules but stop knowing God. In Revelation2, Jesus describes a people who had "tireless labor," "patient endurance," and "intolerance to evil." But his concern was that they had mastered the curriculum while losing the Teacher. That's when love fades, and that autumn feeling of possibility turns into just another routine. We stop looking for ways to learn to love and settle for religious behavior. We act as though we've graduated from God's classroom.

Many Christians graduate too soon—they stop studying God and stop wrestling with Scripture. They become dull to learning because they think they've heard it all before. The moment we stop learning, we stop loving. People don't leave God and lose their faith for lack of knowing the rules. They leave because the stop learning about their first love-God
